### CULTURE TIPS



ORMALLY WE GET THE HEAT from about mid-September to mid-October; then maybe some rain after that time. Once again, things get mixed up.

Rain in significant amounts came in that period, and the heat at the end of the month. With these conditions, the winter weeds have gotten a head start. But with the later heat, it is easy to hoe them out. Once cleared of weeds, it is smart to use a pre-emergent. They are very effective at keep the weeds at bay all winter long. There are many brands out there. All are effective against the weeds on their label. Read it carefully and buy the brand that gets the majority of weeds that are residents in your garden.

Aphids make their appearance as the weather cools and before the onset of winter. They also hide in the folds of the leaves. Systemic insecticides will get those. One spraying now will get you through the winter.

This is the finally call to dig and replant Pacificas. With the rain we've had, they have just the right new root growth that should make transplanting very successful. \* Joe
