#### CULTURE TIPS



ARE NOW HAVING RELATIVELY WARM and dry  $\S$  weather right now. It is perfect timing to get to the winter chores. Plants are as dormant as they ever

will be in our climate. Get going on pruning fruit trees and roses and other dormant shrubs. And this is the time to get your irises cleaned up of dead leaves and weeds. Pull off the dead leaves and then you can cut or tear off diseased and partially dead leaves. Get it done this month because your irises will begin growing in early February. That is the time to feed them fertilizer. Use a balance formula like 10-10-10 or triple 12 or something similar.

GOPHERS! This has certainly been their year. The weather was perfect for them to proliferate. We never have been invaded by so many. Lost count of the number trapped. Back to the Macbee trap. Gave up on the clinch trap; it is too difficult to set and can be wicked on fingers if not set correctly. Right now working on two which have outsmarted my for weeks. One is taking down my reselect Pacificas and the second is extremely aggressive taking down completely 9 clumps of reselect TB's, including completely two selections. Parts of half more have been partially eaten. In trapping it is important to find the main run and place a trap in each direction. My gophers particularly seem to like roses; so I put a bloom or two behind the trap and then close off the hole, so the gopher won't unset the trap by pushing dirt in front of him to close the light hole.

Other baits are available but normally a permit is need. One suggestion I've not tried but might work is to use the poisoned grain in rat poison. Other methods some have used include smoke bombs, auto exhaust, or forcing water to drive the gopher from his run.

Our gophers are most correctly called pocket gophers since they store food in "pocket" they make in their runs. I have found munched irises stored in these pockets and hundreds of oxilis bulbs. Industrious buggers! # Joe
