## From The Prez

**T**he leadership of AIS Region 14 has become keenly interested in two big issues: regional fundraising ideas and regional meeting attendance.

### Fundraising

The region's budget is out of balance. There are sufficient reserve funds to avoid any problems in the short term, but in the long term a balanced budget would be preferable. A few months ago, Anna and David Cadd suggested a fundraising idea: raffling an AIS 14 Life Membership, which is worth \$450. The regional board never discussed and approved this idea, so RVP Lynn Williams asked board members on very short notice to vote on conducting such a raffle during the 2010 Spring Regional (April 24-26, 2010). This process inspired objections from Kitty Loberg, who argued against the raffle approach.

I voted against the proposal because I didn't see an urgent need to approve a raffle while I did see a clear lack of consensus.



The next steps for the regional board undoubtedly will include further discussion of the raffle idea and a search for other fundraising strategies. Your ideas will be welcome!

### Regional Meeting Attendance

The regional board, which includes the society presidents, meets during the Fall and Spring Regional conferences and on selected occasions during other times of the year. (The meeting schedule is not spelled out in the bylaws or standing rules.) Attendance could be better!

The board will consider requiring each society's president or proxy to attend regional board meetings, and to report briefly on the society's recent activities.

In my view, this would be good way to encourage awareness of activities within the region and exchanges of best practices. I will gladly support such an action when the opportunity arises.

### November Meeting

Our November meeting will include voting on board members and officers for 2010. The report of the Nominating Committee is presented elsewhere in this issue of Bay News; nominations from the floor will be welcome as well.

The program for November is still in development, and will be announced via e-mail prior to the meeting.

### CULTURE TIPS

**W**E HAD VERY UNUSUAL HEAVY EARLY RAINS. On the good side if you had your irises replanted, this rain helped settle them in for the winter.

The Pacificas got the necessary moisture to promote root growth and it is now a perfect time to get them dug and replanted. Be sure you don't let their root dry out. Plant them immediately after digging or put them in a bucket of water until you are ready to plant them. Water them in after planting and keep them wet until the winter rains take over.

These heavy rains with warm weather promotes winter weed germination and growth. We fortunately got pre-emergent on just before the rains hit. This will keep the garden fairly weed free through the spring. It is a huge time saver and the irises appreciate not having competition for nutrients.

If you have any seed, get it planted pronto. It needs the coolness of the winter and the rains to stratify it so it will begin germinate about February and March. ❁❁ Joe
